NINE GOOD REASONS TO ATTEND CHURCH WEEKLY

I think I've heard most of the excuses:

- You don't need to attend church to be a good Christian.
- We give our family priority when we miss church to do sports on
- My church really doesn't meet my needs.
- I'm not getting fed at my church.
- Sunday is really the only day we have off.
- My church has a bunch of hypocrites.

Why is it important for us to attend church services regularly? Allow me to share nine reasons.

- The local church was God's plan in the New Testament. From the founding of the first local church in Jerusalem to the growth of new congregations throughout the Roman Empire, the New Testament is clear. God wanted His people gathering regularly and faithfully. All of these churches had problem people. Hypocrisy was real and pervasive, but it was not a valid excuse to give up the local church.
- The Bible speaks clearly about the priority of local congregations. If you read the New Testament from Acts to Revelation, you will see that a gathered church was not just one important factor for the Christian, it was one of the highest priorities.
- We are commanded and designed to enjoy worshipping the one true God as a gathered community. What if church members really did one thing in worship services? What if they asked God to let them see Him and know Him fully as the church gathered together? What if that was the priority over evaluating the style of music?
- A unified church can stand strong in a culture turning away from God. We can't be a unified church with sporadic attendance. We can't stand together if we aren't persistently gathered together. A faithfully attended church is a unified church. A unified church is an evangelistic church.
- The world looks at our priorities and evaluates what we deem as important. We can't expect the community we serve to get excited about our church if the members of the community see it to be a low priority among the members.
- Accountability takes place in the local church. When we gather together worshipping with others, we are holding each other up and accountable. We need people holding us accountable in love. We need others looking after us.
- Families that attend church faithfully and regularly are happier and healthier families. Study after study shows that families who are in church almost every week are among those with the best-adjusted children. Marriages are healthier. Though these studies are affirming, we can see throughout the New Testament how God has a clear and compelling plan for His children and their families to gather together regularly and faithfully.
- Discipleship takes place in the local church. Remember, discipleship is simply becoming more like Christ. We become more like Christ as we gather and worship together. We become more like Christ as we listen to the preached Word every week. We become more like Christ as we do ministry and evangelism through our local church.

9. God gives us great joy when we serve others through the local church. We can experience incredible joy as we serve others. as we put others before ourselves, as we don't focus on our own preferences and desires. We experience incredible joy as we serve other church members and those who reside in our community.

All of these nine reasons, of course, presume we are faithful attenders. We are neither obedient nor are we able to experience the full joy of our church if we attend once or twice a month or even less.

Faithful weekly church attendance is important. It brings us joy. It helps us to grow spiritually. It is one of the primary characteristics of a healthy family.

Above all, it is an act of obedience to God. And that's what really matters.

I know that COVID-19 has hindered our attendance, but attendance is still important! We are sanitizing the building after the 9:00 am service so the 11:00 am service has a clean and sanitized building to be in and the building is sanitized before the next Sunday. If you are having no symptoms and are not in a high-risk group, I encourage you to come back to worship in the building. We need the fellowship of God's people!

Future Growth Funding

\$19,682.62 in a Construction Acct. at First Farmer's & Merchant's Bank \$346,901.07 in a Building Fund at the Tennessee Baptist Foundation.

The Women's Ministry of FBCSH is sponsoring a ministry outreach project to a precinct in the Metro Nashville Police Department and Spring Hill Police Departments. The goal is to help raise morale of these officers during the difficult times of our current days. With guidance from the Fraternal Order of Police, we want to collect, package, and deliver approximately 450 "Snack Bags" to the police departments. Suggested items for the bags includes (but is not limited to) crackers/cookies, lip balm, small note pad & pen, LifeSavers, and small bottled water.

The Ladies *are not* asking for donations of the items, but rather monetary donations so that items can be purchased in bulk to create uniformity in the contents of the bags. A \$100 donation has been received with a challenge for others to match. Any monetary donation is greatly appreciated—Approximately **\$800** is needed.

The goal of \$800 is needed by <u>September 15.</u> Donations should be Designated to **Project Blue** when placed in the offering.
