Community Opportunities

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS

You may have noticed the Domestic Violence (DV) Awareness poster in our women's restrooms. The Spring Hill Municipal Court, in partnership with the TN Administrative Office of the Courts, are participating in an effort to eliminate DV in Court jurisdictions throughout TN. Unfortunately, the scourge of DV exists within our city, our churches, and our homes, and abuses the entire family system.

One study conducted in Ireland looked at 464 young people ages 17-25 who were exposed to parental physical abuse (hitting, kicking, gun threats, etc.) and psychological abuse (arguing, name calling, intimidating, controlling behavior, etc.). While both may affect future wellbeing, the psychological dimension of DV was found more detrimental, including impaired ability to form loving and respectful future relationships, addictions, and self-harm. There is also a high percentage of Officer injuries occurring in response to these volatile situations.

Ignoring DV doesn't make the problem go away. Displaying the DV Awareness poster, with easy tear-off strips with the hotline number 800-356-6767, is a confidential way for those involved, or witnesses to DV. to call and receive needed help or advice. (NOTE: Someone has purposefully torn off all strips on one poster. Please respect those who may need this valuable resource and only take tabs as needed.)
