I would like to share with you an encouraging message that I ran across from Ed Young, Jr. I hope that this will encourage you as it did me.

"Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it, but it is sin living in me that does it." (Romans 7:20)



"Why do I do the things I don't want to do?" This may be a question you have asked yourself when struggling with sin. In reality, this is an age-old question that was asked by the Apostle Paul in Romans chapter 7. When we fall into sin, especially those repetitive sins, we often find ourselves catapulted into a self-incriminating pity party. We think to ourselves: "I'm such a loser. I'm so weak. I might as well give up. Why would anyone have anything to do with me?"

It all goes back to identity. Don't let sin trap you into feeling like a big loser. Sind says that, if you have trusted Christ as Savior, you have a new identity (Christ in you) and you are free from the indictment and control of sin in your life. Christ has made you complete through His life. This is the true identity that brings victory in our life.

So when temptation arises – perhaps through those past memories, bad habits, evil desires – you must say to yourself, "I can't do this, this is not who I am. I have a new identity now." We learn to defeat the struggle with sin when we recognize who we are. As a child of god, you no longer need sin to find fulfillment in life. Rather, Christ living in you wants to fulfill all your longing in His perfect tie and in His perfect way.

Remember who you are. You are not a loser!

Isn't that wonderful news, "You are not a loser!" And because that is true there is a place of service for you. The Nominating Committee is now working to secure new officers and teachers for the next church year. How will you respond when asked to take a place of service? If asked to assume a place of leadership, weigh the question prayerfully and answer as God leads. Say "Yes!" to the Nominating Committee; Say "Yes!" to the Lord.
